Activity Instructions

The image and questions below can be used to engage students in critical thinking and in-class discussion around a key concept that will be tested during the AP exam. To help get you started, we have provided several suggestions on how to use this activity.

- Present the image on-screen to the class or print copies to give to each student or pairs/groups of students.
- Discuss the image and brainstorm the impact of the Gilded Age.
- Pose the following questions to your students. Have students either work together to formulate their answers or have students respond individually.
- Have students share their answers with the class and discuss.
- After the activity, print the image as a poster to hang in your classroom to reinforce the lesson.

Activity Prompts

- 1. How did the Gilded Age produce social reforms and new intellectual movements?
- 2. Do characteristics of the Gilded Age exist today, and if so, in what ways are they similar?
- 3. How did debates over labor and capital in the Gilded Age lead to policy reforms?





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
